Online Learning:

Online learning will start on Monday, May 10th and continue until May 20th. At this time students will be back at school on Tuesday, May 25th. As we work together through this time, our staff would like to take this opportunity to reassure you that we are working hard to provide the best possible learning situation for your child.

The focus for Temporary Online Learning will be on literacy and numeracy. Format for the 2 weeks will be:

30 minute whole class literacy session in the morning followed by small group/individual sessions.

30 minute whole class numeracy lesson in the afternoon followed by small group/individual sessions.

All learning will take place on the Brightspace platform.

Morning and Afternoon attendance will be taken by teachers. It is important that students are using their school email account to login, otherwise they will not be able to access their work.

Student Transportation: 2021-22 registration is now open:

Planning to use Student Transportation in the 2021-22 school year? If so, make sure your child is registered so Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) can plan routes and send your child a bus pass before the first day of school.

All students who indicated needing transportation services through the returning student registration process are now registered. Families registered will receive tentative route schedules and invoices by the end of the month—fees are due June 30, 2021.
