#### Halloween:

This year we will be celebrating Halloween on October 29.

- If students choose to dress up they must come to school in costume and be prepared to wear it all day. There will be no changing into or out of costume during the day. Staff will not be able to assist with costumes. We ask that weapons for costumes stay at home. Please also be mindful of scary costumes as we want even our youngest learners to not be afraid.

#### **Lost and Found:**

Please remember to label all items. As the weather begins to turn cooler - mittens and toques are often left behind in hallways. All lost and found items are collected and checked for name labels and returned to students. Pictures of lost items are also taken and posted to Twitter. At the end of each two week period, any items that are unclaimed are donated.

#### **Visitors:**

Please use the main (front) entrance, sign in (including COVID Screening) and check in with the main office staff. Thank you for your cooperation.

# **Student Drop Off and Visitor Parking:**

Please use the Drop and Go loop for student drop off. **Parking in the loop is not permitted**, **please use visitor parking**.

Upon entering the loop, proceed as far down the loop as possible to make room for other vehicles. Visitor parking is available at the North end of the loop. Drop off and parking is also available on Heritage Drive. Please do not park in the staff parking lot as staff, consultants and other EIPS employees come and go throughout the day.

If you are dropping off your child at the ECS, Grade 1 and Grade 2 doors, once supervision is present, we ask that you leave so that we can limit the number of individuals in these areas as well as encourage more independence with our youngest learners.

From there you can find the email contact information for all your child's teachers and reach out to them directly as needed.

To connect with school administration and main office staff, refer to the **online contact form** to send an email. From the online contact form, you can also send an email to report your child's absence.

# Absences, Lates, Appointments, Leaving for Lunch and Leaving Early:

If your child will be leaving to go home for lunch, leaving school early or absent for the day - please call and notify the office. An agenda note does not always make it to the office.

In the morning if your child is not walking in with their class, they must go through the front doors and check into the office before going to class. If you are dropping your child off, and the class is not outside, direct your child to the office.
