#### Halloween:

This year we will be celebrating Halloween on October 29.

- If students choose to dress up they must come to school in costume and be prepared to wear it all day. There will be no changing into or out of costume during the day. Staff will not be able to assist with costumes. We ask that weapons for costumes stay at home. Please also be mindful of scary costumes as we want even our youngest learners to not be afraid.
- Students will be required to still wear their masks. They might want to consider how to incorporate their mask with their costume. We saw some great ideas last year.
- As we get closer to Halloween and after, please remember Heritage Hills Elementary is a Nut Aware school. We ask that you refrain from sending food to school that contains nuts. Thanks for your help in keeping our students safe.

#### **Visitors:**

Please use the main (front) entrance, sign in (including COVID Screening) and check in with the main office staff. Thank you for your cooperation.

## **Student Drop Off and Visitor Parking:**

Please use the Drop and Go loop for student drop off. **Parking in the loop is not permitted, please use visitor parking**.

Upon entering the loop, proceed as far down the loop as possible to make room for other vehicles. When we park in the drop off loop even for a few minutes it causes traffic to back up and compromises the safety of our students. Visitor parking is available at the North end of the loop. Drop off and parking is also available on Heritage Drive. Please do not park in the staff parking lot as staff, consultants and other EIPS employees come and go throughout the day.

If you are dropping off your child at the ECS, Grade 1 and Grade 2 doors, once supervision is present, we ask that you leave so that we can limit the number of individuals in these areas as well as encourage more independence with our youngest learners.

## **Staff Contact Information:**

EIPS recently made changes to how families can contact staff.

If you'd like to reach out to your child's teacher directly, simply log in to your <a href="PowerSchool Parent Portal">PowerSchool Parent Portal</a>. From the Grades and Attendance page, you can click on the name of any of your child's teachers to e-mail them directly as needed.

To connect with school administration and main office staff, refer to the **online contact form** to send an email. From the online contact form, you can also send an email to report your child's absence.

If you're having trouble with your PowerSchool or Brightspace account, contact the school office. And, of course, we're always just a phone call away if you have questions or need assistance, **(780) 467-7447**.

## Absences, Lates, Appointments, Leaving for Lunch and Leaving Early:

If your child will be leaving to go home for lunch, leaving school early or absent for the day - please call and notify the office. An agenda note does not always make it to the office.

In the morning if your child is not walking in with their class, they must go through the front doors and check into the office before going to class. If you are dropping your child off, and the class is not outside, direct your child to the office.
