- February 1-28 is registration time for 2023-2024 school year
- Trustees will be looking at school fee parameters at Jan. 19 meeting
- Annual education results report has been published
- The approval processes for Sherwood Heights have been completed; they are in the design stage. EIPS would like to manage the construction process.
- Enrollment for LOGOS has not been sufficient; re-registration numbers will be helpful in deciding the program's future

- Treats for staff and volunteer supervision on the last day of school before break was greatly appreciated
- School has received various funding and is looking into additional EA time
- Mme. MacDonald will be full-time in grade 2 F.I.
- Mme. Johnston will support F.I. grade 5 with some core subjects
- Mrs. Clark will move to support students who qualify for learning disruption funding for numeracy (Gr 1-4); kindergarten teacher Mme. Pointallier will cover her classes
- School education plan and assurance review in December attended by Mrs.
 Wells-Taylor, Mrs. Clark, Simone Kilbeck
 - All results sent to district office where it is compiled
 - HHE literacy scores have increased significantly (performing above EIPS results)
 - Parent involvement and engagement has been an important focus (meet the staff night, Halloween dance, etc.)
 - o This plan should drive our school's priorities
 - The data from the EIPS survey is on their website

- How do we engage grade 4 parents to fill out the survey? Participation has been low
- New assessments required by the provincial government for Gr 2-3-4: LENS,
 CC-3. Reading and decoding regular, irregular, and nonsense words. The school is still waiting on Alberta Ed for results from this testing (completed in September).
- School plans to share math results/information at next meeting
- January 26 Math Night for parents where they can learn strategies and games for home
- Minecraft design challenge design the new Sherwood Heights school. EIPS students will
 interview architects, listen to an interview with the superintendent, etc. and work in
 teams. HHE Grade 3-6 design club at lunch January to May.
- Yearbook update: there will be a pre-sale soon. The yearbook club had their first meeting today 50 students! Julie from LifeTouch will come out to work with the group and decide on a theme.

- School fees: official fees for 2023-2024 will be presented at March's council meeting

 - COSC met last Wednesday
 - HHE is open boundary, deadline is February 28th with no extensions
 - EIPS did a pilot project for the Reset Room; it was very successful and now all junior high schools have been approved to have one funded by Alberta Education
 - ATA doing public engagement on Jan 18th 6:30 Bev Facey library
 - AGM on April 23rd Alberta School Council Association. We would need to discuss what our resolution would be at our March meeting.
 - School council engagement grant \$500 these grants were pooled last year.
 - Council voted unanimously to pool the grant
 - If pooling money, hoping to have 1 of the following 2 speakers: Debbie Pusher, David Irvine. There would also be a speaker from ASCA sharing information on how to effectively run a school council.
 - Discussion about attendance at school mental health factors are coming into play; there is a presentation on the EIPS website from Marcus Reed about this.
 - Some schools have begun to have harvest baskets/food available at the school
 - The trustees find these meetings helpful so it is likely that COSC will continue to operate under new superintendent
