Parking & Student Drop Off At HHE

VISITORS: All visitors are welcome to park in visitor parking at the north end of the drop off loop, in front of the playground, or on the street. The main parking lot is reserved for staff only. Staff, Consultants and District Personnel come and go throughout the day and it becomes difficult if staff parking is full. Parents, please refrain from using the main lot when visiting or dropping off and picking up your child(ren). Thank you for your cooperation.

DROP OFF: Our student drop off loop works very well when students are dropped off and cars move along. If you are leaving your vehicle to walk your child to the door or visit the office, please do not park in the drop off loop. This can cause congestion very quickly. As the weather gets colder more families will use the drop off loop.

Pay School Fees Online:

School fee information for the 2022-23 school year is now posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the **PowerSchool Parent Portal** and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online.

Don't forget to also log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as extracurricular fees, lost library books/textbooks, yearbooks and more.

If circumstances exist where you are unable to pay your fees, you can apply to have certain <u>fees waived</u> by submitting an <u>Application for a Waiver of Fees</u>. The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2022.
