Principal:

Hope you are enjoying the great fall weather we are experiencing this year. Last week, we had Student/Parent/Teacher Conferences. We want to thank you for your participation in this event. Home and school communication is essential if we are to maximize student learning. Home and School communication can take place in a variety of ways which include: classroom newsletters, emails & phone calls with teachers and school staff, Parent Weeklies, participating in school events and attending school interview evenings. We have a variety of learning supports for our students at HHE and good communication will enable us to work together to support all our students.

A Day In The Life of a Teacher At Heritage Hills:

A teacher's day can be very busy. Here is a typical day of a teacher at Heritage Hills Elementary. Teachers arrive at school anytime starting at 7:15. Some work with students while others complete their planning from the night before, such as photocopying and putting items up in their classroom. Some will start outside supervision at 8:10 and the rest of the staff will be out by 8:20. From that point until noon teachers are working with students. All teachers get a 30 minute lunch break but many run student clubs during their lunch hour or prepare for the afternoon. While the students are outside for their 30 minute lunch recess, teachers provide the supervision. From 1:00 pm - 3:20 pm teachers are back in the classroom with their students. Once the bus supervision is over, teachers sit on various committees, do sports clubs and prepare materials for the next day's lessons. In the evenings, teachers plan for instruction, do paper work, answer emails and a variety of other school tasks.

As you can see teachers have a very busy day. It's a great day, but very busy. If emails are sent during the day to teachers or phone messages are left, they will probably not have the time to answer them during the school day or even that evening. It may not be until the end of the next day before you get a response. But you will get a response.

Counsellor:

Highlighting the positive and having meaningful conversations with your children about school matters. Parents and students often focus on what is wrong by ignoring what is going right. Here is a collection of 24 school day inspired questions that are proven to overcome the 'yes' or 'no' one word responses and get your child talking.

Pay School Fees Online:

School fee information for the 2022-23 school year is now posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the **PowerSchool Parent Portal** and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online.

Don't forget to also log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as extracurricular fees, lost library books/textbooks, yearbooks and more.

If circumstances exist where you are unable to pay your fees, you can apply to have certain <u>fees waived</u> by submitting an <u>Application for a Waiver of Fees</u>. The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2022.

- Gallery@501 in Sherwood Park has a wonderful <u>Alex Janvier exhibit</u>—on now until November 20—"The Healing Language of Alex Janvier" by world-renowned Denesuline artist, Alex Janvier, from Cold Lake First Nations, Treaty 6 Territory. Curated in partnership with the Janvier Gallery and Gallery@501, this exhibition features paintings, sketchbook drawings, video and audio works that reflect Janvier's experiences within Canada's residential school system.

She is an advisor with the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Education team where she supports staff, students, families and communities. Leaha has a degree in social work from the University of Regina.
