Returning Student Registration for 2023-24

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will once again conduct an online returning student registration process to confirm student registrations for the 2023-24 school year. Families of all current students—with the exception of graduating Grade 12 students—must complete the process to confirm the school their child plans to attend in the 2023-24 school year or advise the Division of their plans not to return to EIPS. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. The 2023-24 returning student registration takes place Feb. 1-28, 2023.

Access to the Returning Student Registration Form is provided through the **PowerSchool Parent Portal**. If you don't have a PowerSchool Parent Portal account, you need to set one up before Feb. 1, 2023. **Create a PowerSchool Parent Portal account**

First Nations, Métis and Inuit

Thank you to all the parents who stopped by to visit with Cheryl Devin, our First Nations, Métis and Inuit Education Consultant, and experience the large Indigenous Peoples of Canada map last week during Parent-Teacher Interviews. We hope you enjoyed it! We also had a special visit by Elder Wilson who came to talk to a class of Grade 5 - they will be participating in a special event next month related to Residential School Survivors and the Seven Sacred teachings.

On Thursday, we look forward to having Jeremy Albert, another one of our education advisors, teach our students about Winter from an Indigenous perspective. We were hoping to use the Outdoor Classroom, but the cold weather may require us to stay inside. Be sure to ask your child about the experience!

Watch for Thin Ice

Remember, be aware of thin ice this time of year. Depending on changing temperatures, ice can form and melt to varying degrees on outdoor bodies of

water. Try to remind your child about the dangers of thin ice, obey all posted signs, take proper care and remain a safe distance from the ice.

Did you know?

The colour of ice may be an indication of its strength. Clear blue ice is the strongest. White opaque is half as strong as blue ice. And, grey ice is unsafe—greyness indicates the presence of water.
