#### **Counsellor:**

**Saturday, May 13,** 11am. to 3pm at the Strathcona Athletic Park. The Strathcona County Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) have organised a <u>Bike Rodeo and</u> <u>Safety Fair</u>.

Enjoy specialised police demos, including the canine unit at 12pm. and 2pm. There'll be a free bike rodeo for children to learn about bike safety and test their skills on an obstacle course, in addition to other fun activities.

Attendees can also get free helmet checks and bike inspections from vendors and visit displays and info booths from community safety partners.

Alberta Health Services offers free online programming for parents and caregivers of children and youth. Sessions are offered through Zoom. # First Nations, Métis and Inuit

**Red Dress Day is May 5**. This day honours the memories of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls across Canada. This is a sensitive topic - if teachers choose to talk about this day, they will use age-appropriate resources.

Moose Hide Campaign Day - May 11 - The Moose Hide Campaign is a movement of Indigenous and non-Indigenous men and boys working together to end gender-based violence. This campaign is now starting to be part of conversations in schools. A cornerstone of the campaign is the moose hide pin. Wearing the pin signifies your commitment to honour, respect, and protect the women and children in your life and speak out against gender-based and domestic violence. To date, over three

# Grades 6 and 9 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs)

# **Ouick Facts for Students and Parents/Guardians**

#### What are Provincial Achievement Tests?

Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) are administered to students in grades 6 and 9 and have three main purposes:

• to determine if students are learning what they are expected to learn;

• to report to Albertans how well students have achieved provincial standards at given points in their schooling;

 to assist schools, authorities, and the province in monitoring and improving student learning.

#### When are Provincial Achievement Tests administered?

PATs are administered annually in May and June in English and French language arts, mathematics, science and social studies in grade 6 and grade 9.

# Are there any practice questions my child can do before writing Provincial Achievement Tests?

Yes. Students can try out the released questions from previous provincial achievement tests that are located at <a href="https://questaplus.alberta.ca">https://questaplus.alberta.ca</a>

#### When will I find out my child's Provincial Achievement Test results?

School staff share preliminary results with parents after the PAT administration. Individual Student Profiles (ISPs) are available to schools in the fall of the following school year. School staff will provide parents access to their child's ISP through at least one the following options:

- Forward the PDF ISP electronically to parents using the school's digital system

- Print and mail a paper copy

- Sign-up parents for MyPass where they may access their child's account and results directly

- A record of the ISP must be retained in the student's record in accordance with the Student Record Regulation.
