Principal:

Student Drop Off:

At Heritage Hills Elementary we are very fortunate to have a student drop off zone in front of the school. Many parents drop off their children between 8:15 and 8:25. As the cold weather sets in, we will have many more students being dropped off. This means more vehicles. In order to keep the traffic moving effectively, it works best when students are dropped off and the cars move along. When cars are parked in the student drop off, the backlog of vehicles starts immediately. If you walk your child to their door or need to come into the school, please use the visitor parking or park on the road in front of the school. Please do not park in the student drop off zone.

Counsellor:

On Thursday, September 28th at 5:30 pm, a two-hour presentation from Saffron/Glen Allan Elementary is available for parents and caregivers. The presentation will explore practicing Internet safety with children and youth and ways to respond to technology-facilitated sexual violence.

The presentation will cover a variety of topics from social media to gaming and chatrooms to live streaming. It will discuss ways to promote boundary-setting and options to protect privacy online.

The presentation includes a discussion on pornography and the sexually explicit content that youths may be exposed to, focusing primarily on the effects this has on their developing brains and relationships, as well as on strategies for navigating these difficult conversations. We will also discuss sexting and review the Criminal Code.

The presentation includes content on relevant trends in technology-facilitated sexual violence – such as sextortion, grooming, luring, and child sexual abuse material.

The goal is to encourage parents and caregivers to feel equipped to both prevent and respond to these issues by identifying the warning signs, creating a dialogue with youths, and recognizing the resources available to support them.

New Access for Online photos

Great news! There is a new way for families to access their photos online.

After much safety and security testing, Lifetouch is pleased to announce that it has developed a way for families to access their child's photo online using their Student ID Number.

It's just so easy!

- Go to mylifetouch.ca
- Click on "Student ID"
- · Enter in your school's city, province, and school name
- Then click the blue button "Continue"
- . Enter in your child's full name, student ID number and the relationship to student
- Then click on the blue button "Find Student"
- Once the image of your student comes up, you can click on the blue button "Yes this is my student"
- From here you can go onto order from one of our many photo package offerings

Caregiver Education Sessions:

Alberta Health Services hosts a variety of virtual caregiver information sessions throughout the year focused on ways to support students' mental health. The sessions are free and geared toward parents, caregivers, teachers and community members who want to learn more about challenges impacting children and adolescents. Session topics include anxiety, ADHD, depression, self-harm, technology, teens and teaching leadership skills, communication, resiliency and more. Respiratory Illness Guidance

The health and safety of staff, students and visitors is a top priority. Continue to reinforce the following hygiene habits to protect staff and students from spreading respiratory illnesses, including COVID-19.

- · Stay home if you're feeling sick.
- · Wash or sanitize your hands often.
- · Cover your coughs and sneezes.
- · Avoid touching your face.
- · Clean and disinfect high touch surfaces regularly.
- · Wear a mask if you get sick or develop symptoms while at school or work.

As per Alberta Health guidelines, staff, students, contractors and visitors who have symptoms of respiratory Illness or test positive for COVID, should stay home until:

- · symptoms have improved,
- \cdot they feel well enough to resume normal activities, and
- \cdot they have been fever-free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications.

For anyone who has a respiratory illness or has tested positive for COVID, it is recommended that they wear a mask for a total of 10 days from the onset of symptoms—even if the symptoms have resolved or improved—when in indoor settings with other individuals.


