## **Fees Feedback:**

At our January 17, 2024 school council meeting, we had our first discussion regarding the upcoming 2024-2025 school fees. If you were unable to attend, we would appreciate **feedback and suggestions** you may have regarding fees.

Thank you to the families who have already completed the feedback form. We wanted to clarify a few questions that have already come up.

#### **Lunch Leaders:**

During the 2022-2023 school year, Ms. Wells-Taylor brought forth the idea of lunch leaders at school council. School council provided feedback and we decided to move forward with lunch leaders. Lunch leaders are students who expressed interest in working with the younger grades during lunch. They will often play games with the students or read to a group once the students have finished their lunch. Lunch leaders do not replace Noon-Hour Lunch Supervisors which are EIPS employees. We are currently reviewing lunch leaders again as parent feedback suggests they would like to see lunch leaders discontinue.

## **Lunch Supervision:**

At HHE, we have the following Noon-Hour Supervision.

Lunch supervision fees go towards the classified staff supervisors and are cost recovery. If there are not enough fees collected, the school is required to cover the cost out of the school budget. We have 19 classrooms and 10 supervisors and this gives us a ratio of approximately one supervisor for every two classrooms. Certificated staff are teachers but they are not paid out of lunch supervision fees. This is assignable time for them and is a part of their regular job duties.

The following are some of the responsibilities of our noon hour supervisors:

- Supervise and ensure student safety within an assigned area of the play.
- Assist students with coming inside after outside play.
- ullet Watch students in different classrooms while they eat f
- ullet Help monitor behaviour and encourage positive interaction between students f
- Encourage students to follow classroom lunch rules and handle minor infractions *f*
- Make sure students dispose of garbage in receptacles and recycling containers
- Many of our noon hour supervisors also have First Aid Training.

#### **Field Trips:**

Field Trips are planned by grade groups or by individual classroom teachers. If wondering about the process, please refer to <u>Administrative Procedure 260</u> to have a clearer understanding of the different types of field trips. Every year, teachers decide on the field trips they feel complement what students are learning in school.

# **Bus Loop:**

When you are dropping off your children please use the student drop off area; drop them off and move on. If you need to go into the school or park for a few minutes please use visitor parking or park on the road in front of the school. Once we have a traffic jam it becomes unsafe for our students. Parking in Staff Parking is not permitted at any time.

Thank you for your cooperation and helping us to keep staff and students safe.

# **Kindergarten Registration Starts Soon!**

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2024? If so, it's almost time to register for kindergarten.

Kindergarten registration opens for the 2024-25 school year at 9 a.m. on Feb. 1, 2024.

To help families prepare, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online **EIPS Kindergarten Tool kit** to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect, eligibility, how to find your designated school, transportation and more.

# **Returning Student Registration: 2024-25:**

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will once again conduct an online returning student registration process to confirm student registrations for the 2024-25 school year. Families of all current students—with the exception of graduating Grade 12 students—must complete the process to confirm the school their child plans to attend in the 2024-25 school year or advise the Division of their plans not to return to EIPS. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. The 2024-25 returning student registration takes place Feb. 8-21, 2024.

One contact for each current PALS to Grade 11 student will receive the Returning Student Registration Form link through Permission Click on February 8. The recipient is based on which contact has been identified as the one to receive forms as listed on the most recent registration form, Correction and Verification Form or Student Information Update submitted to the Division. To review the contacts listed for each student, refer to the Student Information Update available through the **PowerSchool Parent Portal.** Only one contact can be selected to receive forms.


