Update regarding Grade 6 PATS:

Alberta Education has made the decision to not administer the Grade 6 English Language Arts and Literature (ELAL) and Mathematics Provincial Achievement tests (PATs) this school year. The government continues to work on updating these standard tests to align with the new curriculum. Grade 6 students will not have PATS for these two subjects this May and June.

Grade 6 students will still write the following tests in June:

- Grade 6 French Language Arts Partie A/B (French Immersion students only)
- Grade 6 Social Studies (French Immersion and English students)
- Grade 6 Science (French Immersion and English students)

Journee nationale de l'immersion:

On April 24th, we will champion the vital role of French Immersion programs by celebrating Canada's National French Immersion Day. French Immersion remains the optimal route to bilingual proficiency within Canada's education system and contributes significantly to bilingualism across the country. This is a day to highlight the remarkable contributions of individuals and organizations, including students, teachers and schools, devoted to promoting French Immersion!

Sometimes, people think being bilingual simply means knowing two languages, but it's much more than that. Language is a powerful way to show how we see the world. Through language, people communicate not only words, but subtle nuances of meaning. Whether through idioms, metaphors, or word choice, language reflects cultural values, societal hierarchies, and historical contexts. For instance, greetings in different cultures may reflect attitudes toward politeness, hierarchy, and familiarity. Languages often have words or expressions that are untranslatable, capturing unique cultural concepts and experiences. French Immersion helps students gain exposure to ways that languages interact and change over time; students can participate in the global community in more ways, get information from more places, and learn more about people from other cultures. Well worth celebrating!

To gain insight into the subtleties of language, families can explore <u>1000 images on</u> <u>the tip of my tongue</u> to discover and compare common expressions and figurative language in English, French and Spanish.

Our fundraising focus for the 2023-2024 school year is the completion of our outdoor playspace. We currently have about \$55,000 raised to go towards this project. We have reached this total with the support of our hot lunch and treat days, using our casino revenue from last year, as well as budgeted items that have had the cost covered by the school (Christmas concert, Carnaval activities and staff Christmas lunch to name a few). We are hoping to reach a goal of at least \$120,000. To help reach this goal we will be applying for a provincial matching grant in the spring so every dollar we raise until then counts!
